Forgiveness: to suffer all the consequences of a person's action,



and release the person from punishment,

without retaliation, bitterness, or anger.

How does God forgive us when we sin against Him? Let's start from the beginning. *"In the beginning there was God..."* (Genesis 1:1a)

GOD is life. He is all-powerful, holy, and righteous.

- God is life. He is the creator and sustainer of all life. Apart from God there is no life.
- > God is all-powerful. He can do all things.
- God is holy. He is separate from all things that are not pure, good, and just.
- > God is righteous. He only does what is right.

God breathed His Spirit into humanity. We became a living soul made in His image. (cf. Genesis 1:27, 2:7)

The soul is our life force in us. It includes the mind, will, and emotions.

Soul

Every soul is created in the image of God. And every soul is created to live in relationship with God and one another.

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God created humanity spiritually connected to Him. All true wisdom, knowledge, and life flows through this connection. Because God is Life and He is holy, sin cannot stay in His presence.


As a result, it is written: *"The wages of sin is death..."* (Romans 6:23)




What is sin?


(cf. Exodus 20:1-14; Matthew 5:21-22, 28; Galatians 5:19-21; Ephesians 4:29, 5:1-6; Hebrew 10:24-25)

"The wages of sin is death..." (Romans 6:23)

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)



"As it is written: 'None is righteous, no, not one.'" (Romans 3:10)



"The wages of sin is death." (Romans 6:23a)

What is death? Death is separation from God, the source of life.

"It's your sins that have cut you off from God." (Isaiah 59:2)



"The soul who sins shall die." (Ezekiel 18:20)

Death is spiritual separation from God (Isaiah 59:2); then physical separation (Luke 9:60); and lastly eternal separation from God in the lake of fire. (Revelation 21:8)



"The wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23)



What is the "free gift of God?"

A free gift is the opposite of a wage. We cannot earn it and we do not deserve it.



The free gift is 100% unmerited favor--grace!

- It is eternal life.
- It is reconciliation with God.
- \succ It is the forgiveness of sins.

To forgive us, God came to earth in the form of man to suffer the consequence of sin as preplanned by Him and foretold by the prophets.




The angel said, "'The child within her [Mary] was conceived by the Holy Spirit. And she will have a Son, and you are to name Him Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins.' All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet: 'Look! The virgin will conceive a child!'" (Matthew 1:20–23a, NLT; cf. Isaiah 7:14)

To forgive us, Jesus went "throughout all the cities and villages" proving He is one with the Father through His teachings and ministry. (cf. Matthew 9:35)

Jesus taught, *"I and the father are one* [oneness; same essence; one in purpose and will]." (John 10:30)

Jesus also declared, "Your sins are forgiven." (Luke 5:20, 7:48) Notably, "Only God can forgive sins." (Luke 5:21, NLT; cf. Isaiah 43:25; John 5:18; Philippians 2:6)



To forgive us, Jesus continually proved He has the power over sin and all its consequences by "healing every disease and every affliction." (Matthew 9:35)

"So that you [the unbelieving crowd] may know that I have the authority on earth to forgive sins' —Jesus said to the paralytic— 'I say to you, rise, pick up your bed, and go home.

He rose and immediately picked up his bed and went out before them all, so that they were all amazed and glorified God." (Mark 2:10-12a)



To forgive us, Jesus proved that He would suffer the painful separation (death) that sin causes by foretelling His death.

Jesus proclaimed, "Everything that is written about the Son of Man [Jesus] by the prophets will be accomplished.

He will be delivered over to the Gentiles. They will mock Him, insult Him and spit on Him; they will flog Him and kill Him.

On the third day He will rise again." (Luke 18:31-33, cf. Matthew 9:35)



To forgive us, Jesus lived a sinless life making Him the perfect "gift of God" who laid down His life on our behalf. His sacrifice is the means by which believers are made right with God.


"God made Jesus who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Corinthians 5:21)



To forgive us, Jesus suffered the consequences for all sin.


"But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)

"The death He died, He died to sin once for all." (Romans 6:10)



To forgive us, our sinless Savior took on our sins and suffered the death we deserve on the cross.

"He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed." (1 Peter 2:24)



To prove His forgiveness, Jesus conquered sin by rising from the dead.

"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures [the prophesies],



- that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures [approximately 300 prophesies],
- and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.

Then He appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep." (1 Corinthians 15:3-6)

Forgiveness:

1) To suffer the consequences of a person's actions;

2) release the offender from punishment;

3) without retaliation, bitterness, or anger.

<u>Romans 6:23</u>

"The <u>wages of sin is death</u>" - Forgiveness petitions God's forgiving nature to come to earth and suffer our consequences, our death, for us.

"but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus" - Only the person against whom we have sinned can forgive us. We sinned against God and His law. Jesus is one (same essence) with God the Father. Therefore, forgiveness is "in Jesus" alone.

"<u>our Lord</u>." - Jesus conquered death! "He has removed our sins as far from us as the east is from the west." (Psalm 103:12, NLT) He becomes our Lord, Master, and Savior when we, by grace through faith, turn to Him and away from our sins.

Jesus, our high priest, is in heaven praying for us and calling us to believe!

"Jesus is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them." (Hebrews 7:25)




• We pray to Jesus, in His name. He is our sinless High Priest. Praying to anyone else, in any other name, is idolatry.

The free gift of God is coming in fullness!

"So Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for Him." (Hebrews 9:28)

- Decide to be baptized into Christ. (Romans 6:1-4) Contact your local church.
